When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe."

Vestry Notes

March 15, 2021

All Saints' vestry met on March 15 via Zoom. Following a mediation by Amy Gaynor, Sheldon Taylor provided the Treasurer's Report, noting that planning for the 2020 audit is in progress and that we have submitted an application for forgiveness of the 2020 PPP loan. Capital improvements to the Pritchett Center and roof are ongoing, and bids are expected within two weeks for the work to be completed on the commercial space to prepare it for leasing. The vestry approved the Final Parochial Report, which includes reference to the congregation's work on racial justice and reconciliation. Arjun Srinivasan gave the Senior Warden's Report. Outdoor, in-person worship will resume starting Palm Sunday, now that public health protocols allow for additional in-person attendance. Simon

gave the Rector's Report and indicated that options for indoor, in-person worship are being considered now that Bishop Wright has approved indoor services. Natosha Reid Rice facilitated a lengthy discussion entitled "What we are learning about All Saints' and Race." The vestry was encouraged to consider All Saints' strengths and weaknesses as we move into the journey of racial reconciliation and to identify the risks and opportunities ahead and to consider what we would want a person 50 years from now to say about how All Saints' met today's challenges in the work of racial equity, justice, and healing. Following an Order for Evening, the meeting was adjourned. The next vestry meeting is set for Monday, April 19, at 4:30 p.m.
