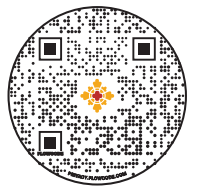



Vestry Notes

October 18, 2021 |

All Saints' vestry met on Oct. 18, 2021, in person, with some joining by Zoom. Following a meditation by Russ Wofford, the vestry shared reflections on their on-going participation in the Sacred Ground curriculum. Mary Jo Bryan gave the Clerk's Report, and Sheldon Taylor provided the Treasurer's Report, noting that overall cash balances are about \$2.3 million and that the balance sheet remains unchanged. The vestry discussed the proposed lease with Midtown Assistance Center for the commercial space at Spring St. and North Ave., with an expectation of an early 2022 move-in, and authorized the Executive

Committee to finalize and execute the lease consistent with the terms previously approved. The vestry approved the Finance Committee's recommendations for funding the required demolition work in that space and also approved All Saints' annual pledge to the Absalom Jones Center. Simon Mainwaring updated the vestry on the work of the Future of the Block Committee. Sydney Cleland led a discussion on the report and recommendation of the Racial Equity and Healing Steering Committee, and the vestry approved the recommendation, which will be presented to the parish on Sunday, November 21, 2021.
