

back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, "Abba! 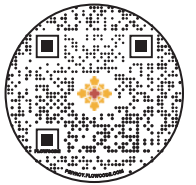


