## Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed

### About Today's Commemoration

All Souls' Day is an extension of the Feast of All Saints. Since at least the first century, the word "saint" was bestowed on persons of heroic sanctity, whose lives were recalled with gratitude by later generations. By the tenth century, it became customary to set aside another day— on which the Church remembered that vast body of the faithful who, though no less important in God's eyes, remain unknown in the wider fellowship of the Church. It then became a day for particular remembrance of family members and friends. In keeping with this custom, we will recall by name those parishioners of All Saints' Episcopal Church who have died in the past two years. Throughout this worship service, you are invited to pray the names of those whom you love, yet see no longer.



## The Word of God

### The First Lesson | Wisdom 3:1–9

But the souls of the righteous are in the hand of God, and no torment will ever touch them. In the eyes of the foolish they seemed to have died, and their departure was thought to be a disaster, and their going from us to be their destruction; but they are at peace. For though in the sight of others they were punished, their hope is full of immortality. Having been disciplined a little, they will receive great good, because God tested them and found them worthy of himself; like gold in the furnace

For the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed. For this perishable body must put on imperishability, and this mortal body must put on immortality. When this perishable body puts on imperishability, and this mortal

body puts on immortality, then the saying that is written will be fulfilled: ‘Death has been swallowed up in victory.’ ‘Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?’ The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

Therefore, my beloved, be steadfast, immovable, always excelling in the work of the Lord, because you know that in the Lord your labor is not in vain.
