# About Today's Commemoration

All Souls' Day is an extension of the Feast of All Saints. Since at least the first century, the word "saint" was bestowed on persons of heroic sanctity, whose lives were recalled with gratitude by later generations.

By the tenth century, it became customary to set aside another day— on which the Church remembered that vast body of the faithful who, though no less important in God's eyes, remain unknown in the wider fellowship of the Church. It then became a day for particular remembrance of family members and friends. In keeping with this custom, we will recall by name those parishioners of All Saints' Episcopal Church who have died in the past two years. Throughout this worship service, you are invited to pray the names of those whom you love, yet see no longer.




