

The First Lesson | 1 Samuel 8:4–11, (12–15), 16–20, (11:14–15)

All the elders of Israel gathered together and came to Samuel at Ramah, and said to him, "You are old and your sons do not follow in your ways; appoint for us, then, a king to govern us, like other nations." But the thing displeased Samuel when they said, "Give us a king to govern us." Samuel prayed to the Lord, and the Lord said to Samuel, "Listen to the voice of the people in all that they say to you; for they have not rejected you, but they have rejected me from being king over them. Just as they have done to me, from the day I brought them up out of Egypt to this day, forsaking me and serving other gods, so also they are doing to you. Now then, listen to their voice; only—you shall solemnly warn them, and show them the ways of the king who shall reign over them."

So Samuel reported all the words of the Lord to the people who were asking him for a king. He said, "These will be the ways of the king who will reign over you: he will take your sons and appoint them to his chariots and to be his horsemen, and to run before his chariots; (and he will appoint for himself commanders of thousands and commanders of fifties, and some to plow his ground and to reap his harvest, and to make his implements of war

and the equipment of his chariots. He will take your daughters to be perfumers and cooks and bakers. He will take the best of your fields and vineyards and olive orchards and give them to his courtiers. He will take one-tenth of your grain and of your vineyards and give it to his officers and his courtiers.) He will take your male and female slaves, and the best of your cattle and donkeys, and put them to his work. He will take one-tenth of your flocks, and you shall be his slaves. And in that day you will cry out because of your king, whom you have chosen for yourselves; but the Lord will not answer you in that day."

But the people refused to listen to the voice of Samuel; they said, "No! but we are determined to have a king over us, so that we also may be like other nations, and that our king may govern us and go out before us and fight our battles."

(Samuel said to the people, "Come, let us go to Gilgal and there renew the kingship." So all the people went to Gilgal, and there they made Saul king before the Lord in Gilgal. There they sacrificed offerings of well-being before the Lord, and there Saul and all the Israelites rejoiced greatly.)







Vestry Notes

April 17, 2021 |

All Saints' vestry met on April 17 via Zoom. Following a mediation by Arjun Srinivasan, Charlie Henn gave the Clerk's Report. Sheldon Taylor provided the Treasurer's Report, noting that Cash balances are approximately \$2.3 million and the endowment balance is approximately \$12.9 million, up around 7.4% for the year. Income and expenses are tracking to budget for the year. We have submitted paperwork for PPP loan forgiveness, and the 2020 audit will be presented to the Finance Committee at its next meeting. In the Rector's Report, Simon announced and the vestry approved the appointment of Sydney Cleland to serve as Senior Warden for the 2021-22 year. Following nominations, the Vestry voted unanimously to approve Dan Pennywell as Junior Warden and Mary Jo Bryan as Clerk. The vestry then discussed and approved an updated set of Covid protocols from the Diocese governing Church-related gatherings. Among other changes, the choir will be able to rehearse and sing, communion may take place at the altar rail, and weddings

will move back indoors. Mark McDonald, on behalf of the Buildings and Grounds Committee, led a discussion concerning the process to select vendors to perform work at the Church. Lori Reinking reported on the work of the Nominating Committee, which considered a number of possible candidates to serve as delegates to the Diocesan Council, and collectively nominated: Lawrence Davidson, Bruce Garner, Mary Helen Miller, Alvin Moore, and David Smith. The Committee nominated the following to serve as alternates: Jerry Byrd, Barbara Hammond, Danny Johnson, Missi McMorries, and Brooke Weinmann. The Vestry unanimously approved the slate of delegates and alternates. Finally, the new Vestry Class (Justin Averette, Greg Cole, Louisa Johnson, Steve Moreland, Gail Rogers, and Charlene Smith-Stewart) introduced themselves and then participated in the Liturgy of Commissioning New Vestry.
