The Gospel | John 11:32–44

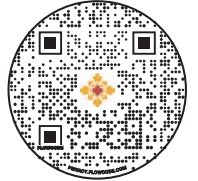

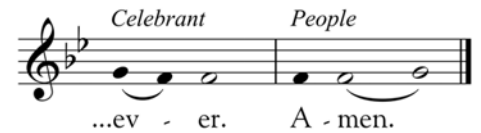
