<i>Bishop</i>	Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

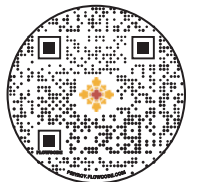

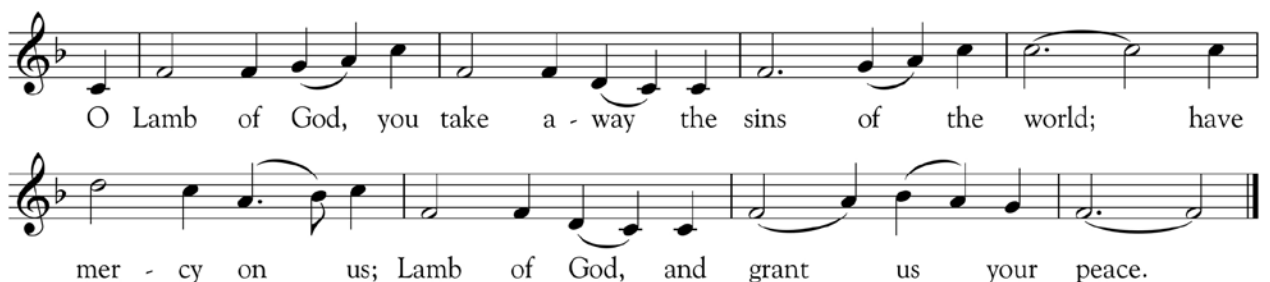
