The Gospel | John 20:19–31

Gospeler The holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, according to John.

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, “Peace be with you.” After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, “Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.” When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, “Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.”

But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, “We have seen the Lord.” But he said to them, “Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put

my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe.”

A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, “Peace be with you.” Then he said to Thomas, “Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe.” Thomas answered him, “My Lord and my God!” Jesus said to him, “Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe.”

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

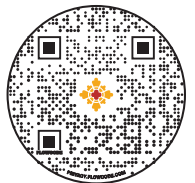



Vestry Notes

March 21, 2022 |

Following a meditation by Gail Rogers, Mary Jo Bryan gave the Clerk's Report, and Sheldon Taylor provided the Treasurer's Report, highlighting that the church is ahead of budget for the year. Sheldon also presented the guidelines drafted by the Capital Replacement and Maintenance (CRM) task force to stabilize and increase the Farinholt CRM Reserve fund for the future. Ellen Hayes presented an update on the annual canvass, highlighting the increase in the number of new pledges that have been received over this time last year, and Bert Clark presented an update on the Planned Giving Committee and the Cornerstone Society, which has about 200 members. presented the 2021 Parochial Report, which the vestry approved. The vestry continued its discussion about a discernment process for the church's future mission and ministries. The next step will likely be the formation of a working committee comprised of vestry members and at-large members. The vestry also shared remembrances of our fellow vestry member Charlene Smith-Stewart, who died in early March, and expressed support for Des Dorsey, who announced his resignation from the vestry effective Easter Sunday. The next vestry meeting is set for Monday, April 25, 2022 at 4:30 p.m.
