The First Lesson | Acts 16:9–15

During the night Paul had a vision: there stood a man of Macedonia pleading with him and saying, “Come over to Macedonia and help us.” When he had seen the vision, we immediately tried to cross over to Macedonia, being convinced that God had called us to proclaim the good news to them.

We set sail from Troas and took a straight course to Samothrace, the following day to Neapolis, and from there to Philippi, which is a leading city of the district of Macedonia and a Roman colony. We remained in this city for some days. On the sabbath day we

went outside the gate by the river, where we supposed there was a place of prayer; and we sat down and spoke to the women who had gathered there. A certain woman named Lydia, a worshiper of God, was listening to us; she was from the city of Thyatira and a dealer in purple cloth. When she and her household were baptized, she urged us, saying, “If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come and stay at my home.” And she prevailed upon us.

The Second Lesson | Revelation 21:10, 22–22:5

In the spirit the angel carried me away to a great, high mountain and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God.

I saw no temple in the city, for its temple is the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb. And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God is its light, and its lamp

is the Lamb. The nations will walk by its light, and the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it. Its gates will never be shut by day-- and there will be no night there. People will bring into it the glory and the honor of the nations. But nothing unclean will enter it, nor anyone who practices abomination or falsehood, but only those who are written in the Lamb's book of life.

Intercessor Mighty Savior, raise up faithful witnesses in our community, that our neighbors might come to know that you love them and have freed them from the power of sin. In the Anglican Communion, we pray for the Province of the Episcopal Church of South Sudan. In our Diocese, we pray for Holy Trinity in Decatur. In our parish, we give thanks for those who tend the buildings and grounds in which we gather, that our buildings, as much as our community, may speak of God’s grace and love. You are our God;
People and we thank you.

Intercessor O Lord, you are good; your mercy endures forever: be the strength of the weak and of those who are sick. (*The names of the sick will be read aloud*). You are our God
People and we thank you.

Intercessor Alpha and Omega, you do not hand your beloved ones over to death, but promise life eternal to all those baptized into your Son: to you be glory and dominion forever. (*The names of those who have died will be read aloud*). You are our God;
People and we thank you.

Concluding Collect |

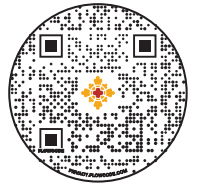

Nancy Dodson, in Sheldon Taylor's absence, provided the Treasurer's Report, highlighting that pledge payments are ahead for the year, that the church received payments for third-party use of Ellis Hall and parking, and that an insurance claim has been made for the water heater that burst in the Pritchett Center.
