

The Gospel | Matthew 2:1-12

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet:

'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah;

for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel."

When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.



Vestry Notes

December 14, 2020 |

The vestry approved the 2021 budget and adopted the Clergy Housing Allowances Resolution. Following a mediation by Sydney Cleland, Sheldon Taylor provided the Treasurer's Report. We are under budget on collections for the year and lease income continues to be well under budget, but expenses also remain below budget by an even larger amount, so the finance committee expects a year-end surplus if pledges convert. The endowment balance at the end of November was \$11.5 million, up about 7% for the year. The 2019 Audit has been completed and approved by the Finance Committee. Arjun Srinivasan gave the Senior Warden's Report, noting that the Covid-19 vaccine is now rolling out. Various factors will influence how quickly the vaccine is distributed, and that will

influence when All Saints' can begin to operate in a more "normal" manner. Simon Mainwaring gave the Rector's Report, focusing on a recap of the church's response in 2020 to the Covid-19 pandemic. Simon recognized the amazing level of dedication, adaptability, and hard work that the clergy and staff have exhibited throughout the year. Finally, the Vestry heard reports from Andy Barnett regarding worship & adult formation, from Jill Gossett regarding the Service Ministries Committee, from Sarah Stewart on the small-group initiative, and from Zack Nyein regarding creative approaches to children and youth ministries, including outdoor meetings around a fire pit in the courtyard. Following a prayer, the meeting was adjourned.


